MOUNTAIN VIEW HIGH SCHOOL

MVHS is accredited by the Northwest Accreditation Commission, a division of AdvancED Accreditation. The school operates on a quarter system with 180 days of classroom instruction per year.

Students may select from more than 225 courses, for eight classes (double block schedule) each semester. Many of the classes include 10th, 11th, and 12th grade students enrolled in the same class. There are 80 certified faculty members with one principal and four assistant principals and four full-time counselors. Masters or Doctoral Degrees are held by 46% of the staff.

CURRICULUM

Mountain View offers a comprehensive program with both college and vocational preparation. Several of our classes are integrated with vocational and academic materials. There is a strong CTE program with students learning skills required for entry level employment. The CTE pathways available are: Agriculture, Business & Marketing, Engineering & Technology, Family & Consumer Sciences, Health Science, Information Technology, and Skilled & Technical Sciences. Additional courses have concurrent enrollment credit available through Utah Valley University with over 400 MVHS students participating. Distance Learning courses are also available.

AP courses are offered in Art Design, Art Drawing, Calculus AB/BC, English Language, Biology, Environmental Science, French Language, Government and Citizenship, European History, Music Theory, Physics, Psychology, Spanish Language, Statistics, US History, and World History.

MVHS has consistently been listed as one of the outstanding AP schools in the nation.

Mountain View offers comprehensive educational programs for intellectually handicapped students. The physical facility is equipped with two elevators, several ramps and automatic door openers. It is wheel-chair accessible.

EXTRA CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

ATHLETICS

Mountain View High School sponsors fourteen sports and 23 varsity teams, including baseball, basketball, cheer, cross-country, football, golf, lacrosse, soccer, softball, swimming, tennis, track and field, volleyball and wrestling. MVHS has won 89 UHSAA athletic championships and seven national championships. AS of November 2021, MVHS has more state championships than any other Utah High school in the sports of girls basketball, boys cross country and girls cross country.

The Utah Interscholastic Athletic Administrators Association (UIAA) awarded MVHS the 5A classification Director's Cup of the 2020-21 and 2021-22 school years. The Director's Cup is awarded for athletic success (40%), academic achievement (40%), and student, school and community sportsmanship (20%).
